Each month we welcome an average of 50 households to the store. They are able to shop for clothing, books, items for their homes, and personal care items for each member of the household. All the items are given freely to our neighbors.

The store also provides wonderful opportunities to spend time getting to know our neighbors.

Our next store is scheduled for Saturday, April 12, 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Volunteers are welcome to come as early as 9:00 a.m. and stay as long as they are able. Because it is a long day for many involved in the store, we also appreciate fresh volunteers in the afternoon to help tear down the store and prepare the church for Sunday services.

Volunteers are also welcome 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. the Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday preceding the store to assist with sorting donations and setting up the store.

Jason Street Apartment Fire

Ash Wednesday 2014 is a day that will never be forgotten at the Brightmoor Campus of Redford Aldersgate United Methodist Church. Our doors opened early in the morning to provide a safe, warm place for the residents of the apartment building destroyed in the devastating fire.

Because we were setting up for our Free Store on Saturday, we were able to immediately provide clothing and personal care items for the residents, many of whom fled the fire with only the pajamas they were wearing when the fire broke out.

The support we received to assist our neighbors was tremendous. In addition to the Red Cross and Salvation Army, we had community members helping sort donations that came in all day long, cook food for lunch, provide dinner, and donate funding for meals on Thursday. We are truly blessed to be part of this wonderful community!

The apartment residents are now being assisted by St. Vincent de Paul Christ the King Conference with their long-term needs. Everyone has been placed in new housing, and St. Vincent de Paul is working on providing new furniture and additional clothing.

The most successful crops included broccoli, potatoes, bell peppers and tomatoes. Throughout the growing season many of our neighbors helped themselves to the garden, which was one of our goals in creating it. Our tomato crop was so successful we were also able to can 40 quarts of tomatoes and use them as a fundraiser to help fund the 2014 garden!

This year promises to be even better with plans for an expanded garden and a rainwater collection system connected to our newly built gazebo.

Volunteer Opportunities

Community Garden

- Bring a group out to work for a day (or longer)
- Collect basic tools to donate to Read Seed Feed for this program. We can use everything from hand tools to circular saws, electric drills, etc.
