Saturdays can be a bit chaotic in a 20 foot by 20 foot Free Store with 100 plus shoppers cycling through, food being brought in, food being prepared, and work groups coming in and out. One Saturday, a young family walked through the front door: a mom, a dad, a toddler, and an infant. It was their

Free Store. Before you can shop today, they'll need to get your name so they can call you up when it's your turn to shop." He then led them to the registration desk before heading out.



This past year, we focused on revamping our volunteer training to include how to be hospitable and how to recognize when people seem lost, and our community responded with incredible care. Even those who are not formal volunteers know how important it is to find a friendly face in a new place. This has been vital as we greeted the more than 6,300 people who walked through our doors in 2017. Not only was that young family greeted and guided into the store, but they were able to find exactly what they needed. They were looking to make their paycheck stretch and we were able to help them with diapers and clothing, the things they couldn't buy with their Bridge Card. In the chaos of life these little moments matter as we help people find support,

connection, and community.

## Focusing Our Mission and Vision

As RBI neared the end of its fifth year of working side by side with the neighbors of Brightmoor and Redford, we began to develop a strategic plan that would support our next five years. With help from a Skillman Foundation grant, the Board of Directors and staff of RBI refined our mission and vision and developed a plan that will drive our focus. Part of our Strategic plan directs RBI to:

- ◆ Train 15-30 people for meaningful employment and service by providing paid training and work experience in a trade;
- ◆ Stabilize one block of Darcy Street, which is located behind our Brightmoor Campus orchard and garden, by rehabilitating four vacant properties on the street; and
- Connect 150 households to supportive services by offering a social worker at each of our free stores and expand on the services that are available to our neighbors.

As we enter 2018, we are excited about the possibilities this refined vision will give us. Of course we cannot continue our work without
