## 2020 Annual Report

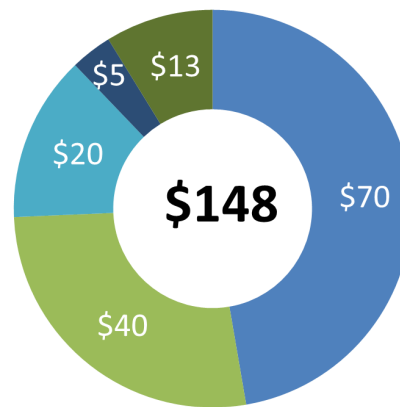

## 2020 Financials

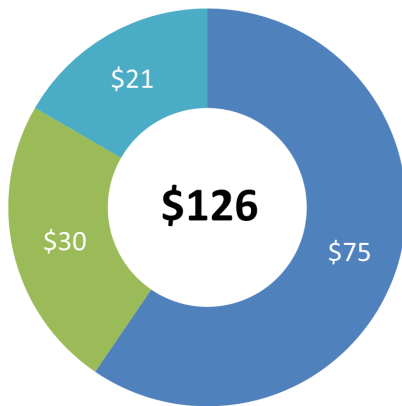

Covenant Community Care assembled a dental office in the Brightmoor UMC's sanctuary. Their mobile program offers free cleanings and check-ups to those that qualify. We look forward to having them back for an entire week this summer!

**75 - FURNITURE ITEMS** were donated. This program continues to be a very important part of RBI. From our "furniture days," to picking up and delivering large household items on Saturday afternoons, we continue to help our clients furnish their homes with furniture, beds, and appliances.



**100 - BACKPACKS** were distributed at the beginning of the school year. Students of all ages were very excited to receive a new backpack full of school supplies.

**125 - TURKEYS & THE FIXINS'** were distributed curbside the weekend before Thanksgiving. In addition to receiving a turkey and a full bag of groceries, people could choose between a delicious pumpkin or pecan pie.

**367 - LOADS OF LAUNDRY** were cleaned during our Wash Wednesday program. RBI continues to assist people with the cost of laundry twice a month at a nearby Redford laundromat.



## **385 - "ONE STOP SHOP" SHOPPERS**

benefited from our holiday program at the beginning of December. In Brightmoor and Redford, attendees received a blanket and pillow, small appliance, full bag of non-perishable food items, gloves and masks, wrapping paper, Christmas napkins, and a family-sized meal.

**The highlight of the program was distributing new toys to nearly 900 children!**

**3000** – rolls of toilet paper, bars of soap, and bottles of hand sanitizer were distributed at our two **FREE STORES** in 2020.

**and ZERO!** The number of weeks that our Free Store in Brightmoor was closed last year. After the first two months of 2020, we were forced to quickly modify our programming and move our Free Stores outside. We began to distribute curbside: personal care items, PPE, food bags, clothing, and household items. Our Community Meal lunch program quickly shifted to "to go" distribution. In October, we moved back indoors with limited capacity.
